1. On Saturday, January 14, 2006, the chapter arranged for a tour to visit the Sea Fighter and learn about the future of Navy ship design. This event took place at 32nd Street Naval Station in San Diego.
2. PetCo Park...A Site to behold! Was the event programmed for Wednesday, 22 February, 2006. This program was presented by Mr. Bill Zondorak, of Jacobs Engineering. Bill Zondorak was Project/Construction Manager for developing construction specification packages for the \$41 Million Ballpark Infrastructure Project, with building demolition of 22 city blocks. He made power point presentation showing the "before" and "after" steps he managed throughout the site preparation activities prior to PetCo Park construction. His discussion covered the challenges and opportunities faced during this process, highlighting some examples of cost effective solutions that resulted from his "team effort". Some details covered buildings that were "imploded" on the site. Bill conducted a Q & A session, and filled audience on the "behind the scene" preparations that are so critical to a project of this magnitude and complexity, in a downtown area.
